PROSPECTUS

St. Peters School is a Minority Institution (Constitution of India Act, 30). It is a recognized but unaided English Medium School, established and administered by Roman Catholic Diocese of Bareilly, a charitable Society (Registered Society). It was registered in Bareilly on 13.4.1989 under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860.

St. Peters School was founded on 08.04.2012. It was established by the then Roman Catholic Diocese of Lucknow with the object of imparting modern education primarily to Catholic Students in a manner that would conserve their "RELIGION, LANGUAGE, SCRIPT AND CULTURE", but is open to all, irrespective of religion, colour, caste and creed.

This Institution is situated on the outskirts of Bailparao and is therefore, an ideal Institution for parents/guardians to whom the health of their children is a matter of great importance. Its imposing building is equipped with electric lights and fans, with its Hall, well stocked Library, Science Laboratories, Reading Room, spacious class rooms and large play ground for foot ball, hockey, cricket, basketball, volley ball, badminton, Kho-Kho and athletics. The school can be compared with the best Institutions in Uttarakhand.



AIMS and OBJECTIVES OF THE SCHOOL

- 1-1 The School is a co-educational institution where boys and girls grow up together in a healthy ambience of equality and mutual respect. This Institution conducts classes from Nursery to Class XII Examination through English Medium. It is recognised by the CBSE Delhi (Affiliation No. 3530530).
- 1-2 The school aims at developing an all round personality of a student by physical fitness, ideals of healthy competitiveness, leadership qualities. Ideals of Indian Culture are instilled in students through games and athletics, Scout/Guide and the monitorial systems, dramatics, public speaking, value education and moral instruction besides catering to the scholastic needs of the students.
- 1-3 Though the medium of instruction and examination is English, the School also gives importance to all co-curricular activities in Hindi, through organising cultural programmes, debates, inter-religious dialogues, speeches and prayer services.
- 1-4 We practice here National Integration through Indian Dance and Music to shape and form Responsible Citizens for an Integrated India.



RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

2. The main purpose and vision of this school is to make the child a good and sincere student, diligent, industrious, honest and truthful in dealing with all. Please co-operate with us in this noble task.
 - 2.1 In order to secure all that is best in education of our children, the maximum co-operation between parents and the School Authorities is desired. Hence parent/guardians are expected to co-operate with the school authorities by enforcing regularity and discipline, by seeking that they prepare their lesson daily, come to school in time, wear a neat and clean uniform and take an active interest in the activities of the school.
 - 2.2 Occasional report about conduct and application of your children will be sent to you by the teachers through the Hand Book. We request you to look into this book everyday and see to it that the lessons and homework assigned for the next day are done regularly.
 - 2.3 Students coming late repeatedly or forgetting to bring books or coming without the proper uniform may be warned/sent back home.
 - 2.4 The Principal must be informed about the absence of the students at once. If sick, a medical certificate is to be submitted along with a leave application within 3 days. In case of sudden leave of a student, the parents are to apply for it in writing that the children will not be sent along with the strangers or neighbours.



- 2.5 When communicating with the Principal, parents/guardians are requested to mention in their letter the name of the student, class and section.
- 2.6 No tuition may be taken from any teacher of the school without the written permission of the Principal.
- 2.7 Parents/Guardians or any other person is not allowed to see the students or interview their teachers during school hours without the sanction of the Principal. They are requested to attend every P.T. meeting.
- 2.8 Parents must intimate the school whenever their residential address or telephone numbers are changed in order to communicate to them in urgent matters.
- 2.9 Whenever notice/complaint is sent for the parents-teachers 'meeting, the parents must attend it and discuss the progress of children/ wards. They can always help the progress of the Institution by way of suggestions, guidance and cooperation.
- 2.10 Criticism of the teachers of School in the presence of the students should be strictly avoided, because it causes them to lose respect for their teachers. If a parent have legitimate complaint, it may be brought to the notice of the Principal.
- 2.11 Should there be any infectious disease in your home, please report the fact to the Principal at once and do not send your child to the class.
- 2.12 No tiffin, books, medicines will be accepted from the parents or others after the school has begun. The students are to bring these by themselves. Students are to bring clean drinking water from home and home prepared tiffin.






ADMISSION





- 3.1 Admission will be made on the result of the interview test depending on the number of seats available in the class concerned. Parents and Guardians should not put undue pressure on the Principal for admission through recommendations or through any other source.
- 3.2 Parents/Guardians of the candidates selected for admission are required to fill up a prescribed admission form and submit it duly signed.
- 3.3 They should also present a Transfer Certificate of their son/ daughter from the School last attended Those students coming from outside the district should have their Transfer Certificate countersigned by competent Educational Authority.
- 3.4 The condition of admission is that Parents/Guardians comply strictly with the terms and conditions herein stated and pay the tuition fees and other charges laid down in this prospectus by the due date. Any future changes made in the prospectus regarding rules or tuition fees or any other charges will also be binding on them.
- 3.5 Generally the admission of candidates from another school shall not be made on the strength of a transfer Certificate but will be subjected to a regular written test in English, Maths, Science, S.St. and Hindi. But students from unrecognized schools will be subjected to a test in all subjects and admitted to the class for which they are found fit.

- 3.6 THE PRINCIPAL RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ADMISSION TO ANY ONE WITHOUT ASSIGNING ANY REASON.

PARTICIPATION

- 5.1 All the students must take part in Games. Physical Drills and extra curricular activities.
- 5.2 When the students are selected for programmes in the school, they are to take part in them actively. The parents are to assist by supplying the dress.
- 5.3 All the students are to participate in the class picnics, group photos, National Public functions, local or National competitions.



PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY

- 6.1 Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books and belongings. The school cannot be held responsible for books, money, clothes and articles that are lost.
- 6.2 Running, playing or shouting inside the school building are prohibited. Any kind of damages done by the pupils to the school equipment, furniture, building etc. for which fine will be imposed by the Principal.
- 6.3 During the absence of the teacher, the class monitor will be responsible for the order and discipline of the class.
- 6.4 No student shall write on the walls, boards, doors or toilets etc. If found, punishment will be severe, such as rustication, dismissal or fine.

- 6.5 When the students move along the corridors as and when changing classes, going for games or experiments to computer lab etc, they must walk in silence in a single line. The teacher in the class should be last one to leave.
- 6.6 All the students should be careful not to throw waste paper everywhere, They should use the baskets and dustbins especially provided for this purpose.
- 6.7 No collection of money for any other purpose what soever, is to be made in the school and no meeting, demonstration, party or picnic may be held, without the previous sanction of the Principal.
- 6.8 Students should not bring newspapers, comics or periodicals to the school.
- 6.9 Students are not allowed to leave school premises without the permission of the Principal.
- 6.10 Every student should endeavour to keep up the good name of the school by excelling in good manners.
- 6.11 The use of pencil sharpeners is recommended.
- 6.12 The students are not permitted to bring any electronic gadgets, calculators, mobiles, video games, sharp objects like knife, or fire arms, pistols, toys, crackers, Holi colour etc. If found guilty, they are liable to severe punishment.
- 6.13 The students or any particular class is not permitted to celebrate any teachers birthday or give any gifts, or collect money for the purpose. The students themselves will not give any gifts to each other in the school. This can be done in their own respective







Homes. The students (Class Nur. - X) who celebrate birthdays are allowed to wear birthday dress and are permitted to take blessings from their teachers. Parents are forbidden to distribute sweets and gifts to the whole class of their child.

BASIC PRINCIPLES OF DISCIPLINE



- 7.0 The attention of pupils and parents/guardians is drawn to the following rules of discipline.
- 7.1 Politeness and courtesy of speech and conduct as well as cleanliness of dress and person should be inculcated.
- 7.2 Pupils should realize that they are responsible to the school authorities not only for their conduct in the school but also for their general behaviour outside. Any reported or observed objectionable conduct outside school on the part of the pupils will be liable for disciplinary action.
- 7.3 Parents or guardians are given to understand that they cannot dictate to the management and that the management has a right to say on what conditions they will admit, retain pupils in their school, provided such conditions are in conformity with the code and instructions of Education Department concerned. Pupils shall not take part in any political activities.
- 7.4 Any pupil who is persistently insubordinate or repeatedly or wilfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractice in connection with examinations or has committed an offence of serious discipline and/or



misbehaviour, or who in the opinion of the Head of the school has an unwholesome influence on his fellow pupil may be expelled permanently or removed for a specified period by the Head of School from the rolls and reason thereof recorded in writing.

ABSENCE

- 8.1 No leave of absence for the whole day or a part thereof is granted except on previous written application from parents or guardians, and only for serious reasons. Absence without leave is liable to punishment at the Principal's discretion.
- 8.2 Repeated absence without leave renders the pupil liable to dismissal.
- 8.3 In case of absence without leave, the student on returning to school must have the reason of absence entered and signed by the parent or Guardian on the "Leave and Absence Record." without this, the student will not be admitted to class.
- 8.4 A minimum of 80% attendance of the working days is required for promotion. Students should come for general assembly on time. Late comers are liable to be sent home.
- 8.5 A student who returns to school after a contagious or infectious disease should produce a Doctor's Certificate for permitting the student to attend the class.
- 8.6 All are expected to attend school on the reopening day after vacation. Similarly no one is allowed to leave for



vacation earlier than the closing day without written permission from the Principal. Students are not allowed to bring any two or four wheelers even if they possess a valid licence.

- 8.7 The school will not arrange any conveyance for the students and staff. The parents/Guardians are to look into the matter of conveyance. The students are to reach in time for the assembly and leave the school soon, when the classes get over.

FEE RULES

- 9.1 WHERE TO PAY THE FEES?

- 9.2 Timing from Monday: 10:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.. Fees must be paid before the due date of each month. In case one fails to deposit the fees by the due date, fees will be accepted with a fine of Rs. 50/- per quarter.

OTHER CONDITIONS

- A) Bank will not accept fees on Saturdays & Sundays and other bank holidays.
- B) Before the withdrawal of a pupil a month's notice in writing or payment of a month's fees in lieu of notice is required.
- C) For any clarifications the school authorities may be contacted.



- D) Fees for April, May and June to be paid by 30th April without fine. No concessions or free education will be given to any student.
- E) Fees for July, Aug. Sep. to be paid between 1st and 30th July without fine.
- F) Fees for Oct., Nov. and Dec. to be paid between 1st and 30th Oct. without fine.
- G) Fees for Jan., Feb. & March to be paid between the 1st and 30th Jan. without fine.
- H) Those children who do not clear the fees of the year, their result will be withheld and T.C. may not be issued.

Note:-

- 1) Students should clear all the fee due to the school and bus by 30th January.
- 2) No student will be allowed to appear for the examination unless all the dues have been paid.
- 3) No exemption or reduction in fees will be made on account of holidays or absence for any cause.

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION

- 10.1 On examination days, no student is allowed to enter the class room before the assembly.
- 10.2 Absence from a paper excludes a student from being ranked in order of merit in the examination.
- 10.3 If any irregularity or unfair means is detected during the examination, the student will be liable to be debarred from examination.







- 10.4 If a child is absent for an examination, he/she may not be permitted to appear for it at a later date. In case of illness a Medical Certificate has to be submitted immediately, and the child's general performance will be taken into consideration or examined later.
- 10.5 All cases of doubt regarding promotion are left entirely to the discretion of the Principal. His decision shall be final.
- 10.6 The school does not undertake to retain answer scripts for more than three months after the examinations.

THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

- 11.1 Strict silence should be observed in the library.
- 11.2 No one can take a book from the librarian without having it duly entered.
- 11.3 Books are issued for the use of the borrower only
- 11.4 Reference books issued may not be taken out of the library.
- 11.5 Student should take great care in handling the books. Books and Magazines for use in the library should be placed back in the same place from where they were taken.
- 11.6 Tearing of pages and pictures from the books or magazines is a bad habit and students should refrain from it at all cost.
- 11.7 The attention of the librarian should be drawn to books that any borrower finds damaged.

- 
- 11.8 Damage done to books or magazines, will have to be made good by the borrower.
- 11.9 All books must be returned before the beginning of each examination; Failure to do so will bar the students from appearing in the examination.
- 11.10 For choice of books for reading, students should avail themselves of the guidance of their teachers.
- 11.11 The students of class I to V should use the library under the guidance of their class teacher.
- 11.12 Failure to return a book by due date incurs a fine of Rs. 2 per day for the time the book is overdue. If a book is lost double the amount will be charged or the borrower will be asked for replacement.

SCIENCE LABORATORIES

- 12.1 Strict silence must be kept in the laboratories during the practical as well as at other times.
- 12.2 No equipment, or chemical, except the ones provided for the practical, should be handled by the students.
- 12.3 Under penalty of exclusion from the practical classes for a whole year, or any other penalty that the Principal deems fit, students are warned not to take any equipment or chemical out of the laboratories without the explicit permission of the Principal.
- 12.4 Damage to any equipment or breakage will have to be made good by the student





12.5 Students must wear a white lab coat in the laboratories.

WITHDRAWALS

13.1 A month's notice of withdrawals must be given in writing duly acknowledged by the Principal or a month's fees in lieu thereof. Students withdrawn in and after April will be required to pay fees for the remainder of that term.

13.2 No Transfer Certificate will be granted unless all school dues are paid and a "No Dues Certificate" is obtained from the Cashier, Librarian etc,

13.3 In all cases of transfer, the full admission fee will be charged.

CONCLUSION

14.1 The Manager reserves the right to waive any of the Rules contained in this Book without assigning any reason for his action.

14.2 The interpretation of any rules in this Book as well as any amendment to it, rests solely and entirely with the Governing Body of the school. Their interpretation shall be final and binding on parents and students and no case shall lie in any Court of Law in respect of the decision.
